MHS Tiger Band Booster Club

Mission Statement: The purpose of the organization is to promote the entire band program of Mansfield High School, by assisting the Band Directors and school authorities in the development of an outstanding band program.

The Mansfield High School Tiger Band Boosters (MHSTBB) **meet the 2nd Tuesday** of each month at **7pm** in the band hall. This is your opportunity to keep informed about what is going on.

By virtue of having a student in band, you are a booster! We welcome you with open arms and look forward to working with you and getting to know you better! This is a great group of band supporters (parents, guardians, and grandparents). MHSTBB is a 501(c)(3) Non-Profit organization. The booster by-laws and budget will be available on-line at mhsband.com.

As available funding in the district continues to be of concern, the goal of the Boosters is to provide the band directors with needed assistance they might otherwise have to purchase with limited funds. To that end, every parent/guardian of a band student is asked to pitch in. We need about 30 volunteers to help out with the success of the Tiger Band at every marching show performance. There are approximately 16 performances and about 200 students in band. If every adult volunteers just once, the task is easily divided among us all. All parents are asked to assist at one performance and one fundraising event.

Booster Teams: Look for the volunteer sign-up sheets at booster meetings or send our Directors of Volunteers an email to get involved. Pick your area of interest/ability, we welcome your time and talents! Per MISD policy, all volunteers must complete a background check via an online form. **The link to the form is available on MHSTBB under external sites tab.** Once your form has been completed and approved, you will then register with the RAPTOR system in the MHS front office using your driver's license. Here is a sample of the teams where your skills and time could be put to use:

- Equipment and Logistics – pit crew, props, CDL driver, welder, pre-performance prep for game nights and competitions (fill coolers/load truck).
- Food Team – Game Day Grub, Competition Grub, Meet the Band Night, judges' meals, H₂O.
- **Preview of Champions-** This is a HUGE and the most important event we do all year! **We will need at least one parent from every student** at this event!!! This year our contest is on Saturday September 25, 2021.
- Band Banquet
- Uniforms – Sewing, sizing,
- Photographer
- Chaperones
- Spirit Wear

Section Parents: We have “Section Parents” for each section. All section parents have at least one year of experience, and the goal is to provide parents with a parent contact who has a student in their child's section. These parents can provide a “parents point-of-view” and solutions for issues within the band. First year parent have many, many questions...the section parents are **THE BEST** source for answers and clarification The section parents will send out monthly emails to provide reminders of upcoming events. Utilizing the section parents for questions about the band will make your family's life easier. The 2021-2022 Band Section Parent List can be found on the MHSTBB.com under contact us tab and on the last pages of this guide. **It is IMPERATIVE that section parents have the best and most accurate e-mail listed in CutTime.**

Emergency Health Form: All students must complete an MISD Student Health Information Form prior to participation in any activity for the school year. These forms are kept with the directors in case of emergency health care needs during the course of the year. Please complete and return the Emergency Health Form on the first day of Band Camp attendance. It is available on mhsband.com.

UIL Physical: Students entering their 9th and 11th grade year of school will need to have a physical by a medical professional and submit both the Medical History Form and the Physical Examination form. For students entering grades 10 and 12 AND who had a physical done prior to the start of their 9th/11th grade year; these students only need to turn in the Medical History Form.

Year 1 and 3: Physical Examination and Medical History Form Required. Year 2 and 4: Medical History Form Required.

Calendar: Check the www.mhsband.com calendar often. See the Calendar section of this guide for an overview of seasonal band activities and events.

CUTTIME: Please go to <https://cuttime.net/createProfile.cfm> and create your profile by following the prompts and instructions.

The MHS band uses Cut time for:

- 1- Email communication
 - A) From MHSTBB parents to all Parents
 - B) From Director to parents
 - C) From Directors to students

It is imperative that you carefully list the correct email address...and an address you will check FREQUENTLY

- 2- Text communication
 - A) From MHSTBB parents to all Parents
 - B) From Director to parents
 - C) From Directors to students

Parents will NOT be texted frequently.

You must choose the appropriate cell carrier for this service to work- please double check that everything is filled out and accurate.

- 3- Financial tracking

Through cut time you can see any monies you earned from fundraising or amounts due...you can even pay online.

- 4- In case of an emergency

The directors have access to cut time on their phone. If there was ever an emergency they will use the information on cut time to call, text, and email you. Hence, it is very important that all information be filled out to the fullest degree and most accurate degree possible. This is incredibly important!

- 5- Check your spam/clutter folder

Especially as you set-up/create your account...the first few message might go to your spam/clutter folder. If this happens please add the cuttime sender to your "trusted" list.... That way the messages go to your inbox.

MMEP: Mansfield Music Enrichment Program – every year, the MHS Tiger Band Boosters set aside funds to assist students with private lessons. Please contact a Director if you are interested in more information.

General Marching Band Requirements

- **Athletic shoes with laces, worn with socks.** Please, no oversized shoes or slip-on shoes. These types of shoes are not made to hold up to the marching band activity and will not allow the student to move effectively and may possibly lead to injury. Footwear needs to be supportive and not cumbersome.
- **Warm weather clothing – shorts and t-shirts.** The lighter the clothing and the lighter the color, the cooler they are in the sun.
- **Sunscreen** – Preferably at least SPF 20. While tans are popular, burns are not.
- **Hat** – Hats will help keep the body cool by blocking the sun.
- **PLENTY OF WATER!!! Every student is to have a hydration back-pack. These packs MUST hold at least ONE LITER of water. However, we HIGHLY recommend a capacity of 2-liters or more.**
- **Flip Folder and Lyre.** All wind players must have their own flip folder and lyre. A lyre is a metal device that attaches the flip folder to the instrument. The flip folder holds music so the student can see it while standing on the field or in the stands. These items are available at area music stores, and are instrument-specific. **A minimum of 15 music sheet protectors will be needed. (clear plastic the fits the size of flip folder)**
- **All Instruments and Equipment** – including mouthpiece and reeds, if needed.

Student Information

Band class enrollment: MISD policy is that any student involved in the band program in high school, must be active in the marching band. (Participating in concert band *ONLY* is not an option.)

In MISD band is a class that meets EVERDAY: This means that the students will have a period of band on “A” day and on “B” day. Based on their audition in May, students will be placed into the classes they auditioned into.

After School Rehearsals: During the Fall Semester marching season, marching band rehearsals are after school, three times a week. Rehearsals will usually begin at 3:45 to allow students time to go to tutoring. Traffic congestion in the parking lot makes it a bad idea for students to attempt to go home between the end of school and the beginning of rehearsal (see Maps on Pages 8 & 9). There will always be rehearsals, rain or shine, so plan accordingly. UIL regulations limit the hours of practice and rehearsals are scheduled not to exceed this limit. Any adjustments to the rehearsal schedule will be announced via the 2017 MHS Tiger Band Facebook page, text notifications, band app, and on www.mhsband.com. (there is no reason to not be informed)

Game Days: In the fall, Varsity football games are generally on Fridays. Depending on the location of the game, students will report to the band hall for a pre-performance meeting and practice at approximately 4 p.m. The

band plays in the stands throughout the game and puts on its “show” performance at half time. The bands always face the home side during the half time performance. Parents are needed to help bring the equipment onto the field. This is an opportunity to watch the show from the home side even when we’re visitors. No student is dismissed from the game. All students must ride the bus to and from the games. There is a post-game meeting in the band hall and students are dismissed once everything is unloaded, properly put away and the band hall is clean. Please note: generally, once competition season ends, the band will no longer perform the “marching show” at football games but instead will perform a “spirit show.”

Extracurricular Activities: Many clubs and organizations meet during lunchtime. Mansfield High School has a variety of fun organizations that meet the many interests our students have. Band members are **encouraged** to be involved with clubs and organizations, both on and off campus. Students may not be excused from scheduled band rehearsals for any other activity; this includes driver’s education. Please plan your driver’s education classes accordingly. (Please refer to the calendar on mhsband.com)

Pep Rallies: ALL band members are expected to perform at all pep rallies wearing the designated band shirts. (or whatever the school dress-up day is) Parents are encouraged to attend – the rallies are quite entertaining. Sign in at the front office to get a visitor’s pass, then come to the gym and enjoy!

Band Council: The formal student council for all student band activities. The band council is a part of the student leadership team and has a variety of responsibilities. The band council is responsible for the organization and production of most band social events.

Student Leadership: Band provides a wide variety of student leadership opportunities that are essential for college applications. Marching leadership includes drum majors, section leaders, captains, loading crew and band council. Leadership training and try-outs occur in the spring.

Sports: It is possible to participate in many sports during marching season that don’t conflict with marching practice and performances. Winter and spring sports fit in much better with the band schedule.

Summer Band Camp: Summer camp starts during the week of July 25th. It lasts all day and through some evenings. You will be working outside and inside for up to 8 hours each day – plan accordingly: hats, sunscreen, water, good shoes and socks. There are several breaks throughout the day and a long lunch. Many sections (instruments) get together for lunch. Older students often offer to give younger students rides, and other students decide to walk to various nearby fast-food stores (i.e. Sonic, Chick-fil-a, Whataburger, Taco Casa or Racetrack), so determine ahead of time if this is okay with parents. The air-conditioned building will be available for eating, resting, and relaxing if you bring your lunch. You will be sore, you will be tired, and you will have fun, believe it or not.

Spirit Show: The spirit show is the early and late season half-time performance show. This show will feature all members of the band. This show is usually filled with “fun” or popular music and has a cute theme. Everyone will have their own drill spots and responsibilities. The Spirit show is constantly rehearsed during the summer camp, and occasionally once the school year starts. After the competitive marching season is done, the band will retire the “contest show,” and go back to playing the spirit show for the remainder of the football season.

Contest Show: The contest show is the competitive performance show. This show is performed for the majority of the football games, and at all marching contests. All eligible students participate in the contest show, but will participate in different ways. Students can earn their own “spot” by competitive audition. This audition is based on mastery of the needed marching and musical demands. Some student will be assigned to share a “spot” and will compete weekly to see who will perform that week. Some students will be in the alternate block where they will play the contest music, from a stationary position.

Spot Auditions: During Summer Band, students will have to audition for “spots” in the competition show. Spots will be awarded to students who successfully meet the musical and marching standards of the MHS Tiger Band. Those students who do not earn a “spot” in the show are still a part of the band. Students who do not receive a spot must still attend all rehearsals and all performances. These students will perform at every performance and contest. Students who do not have a “spot” still contribute to the band’s success, just from a stationary position. All students still travel to and compete at all events and games!

Summer Sectionals: Sectionals during the summer are student led. Many sections have their own Facebook page. Summer sectionals are your opportunity to learn the music, work with your section and make friends before the summer camps begin.

Weather: Texas weather is always questionable. The band directors carry lightning indicators and will not allow students outside during dangerous weather. **Rain or shine, scheduled rehearsals will take place in some way, shape or form.**

Marching Competitions and “Bandtober”: Throughout the fall, the MHS Tiger Band will compete at several marching band competitions as well as at the UIL Region Marching Band Competition (see below). Competitions are generally held on Saturdays, many of them in October. Often, there is a football game the night before – thus the renaming of October to “Bandtober.” Students will meet in the band hall in the morning at a designated call time, and they will not return to the school until late in the evening. Students must ride the bus to and from the performance venue and stay with the band all day. The students will warm up, change into their uniforms, and travel by bus to the competition venue. There they will move through various stages of preparation before taking the field to perform in preliminary competition. There is sometimes quite a bit of time between preliminaries and finals, and depending on the location and the schedule, sometimes students will be taken to spend time and eat at a nearby mall before returning to the performance venue to receive the results of preliminary performance. Should the band qualify for finals, the warm-up process begins again as the band prepares to compete in the finals. After all of the finalist bands perform, there is generally an exhibition performance while scores are tabulated. Scores are announced, awards are presented, and then the band boards the bus to return to the school. Procedures back at the band hall are the same as those following a football game: no one leaves until uniforms are neatly stored and everything is put away. Chaperoning a competition is a lot of fun, but it is a very long day, requiring a lot of standing, walking, and climbing up and down stadium stairs. Parents are encouraged to drive themselves to the competition venues to cheer on the band. Tickets must be purchased on site to attend these competitions, and often only cash is accepted. Some venues offer separate tickets for preliminaries and finals or a “combo ticket.” We will post basic information about the competitions and also maps to the competitions on the mhsband.com website and most competitions also have their own websites with information about tickets and performance schedules, etc.

Private Lessons: All students are encouraged to take private lessons. Many lesson teachers are available during concert band class time. The Band Boosters offer scholarship assistance. (MMEP) Lessons during the summer months are a GREAT way to get a “leg up” on everyone else.

Senior Scholarships: Every year, the MHS Tiger Band Boosters set aside funds to provide scholarships to graduating seniors. To apply, seniors need to be accepted to an institute of higher education, although they do not need to be music majors. We are proud to be able to offer this to all senior band members.

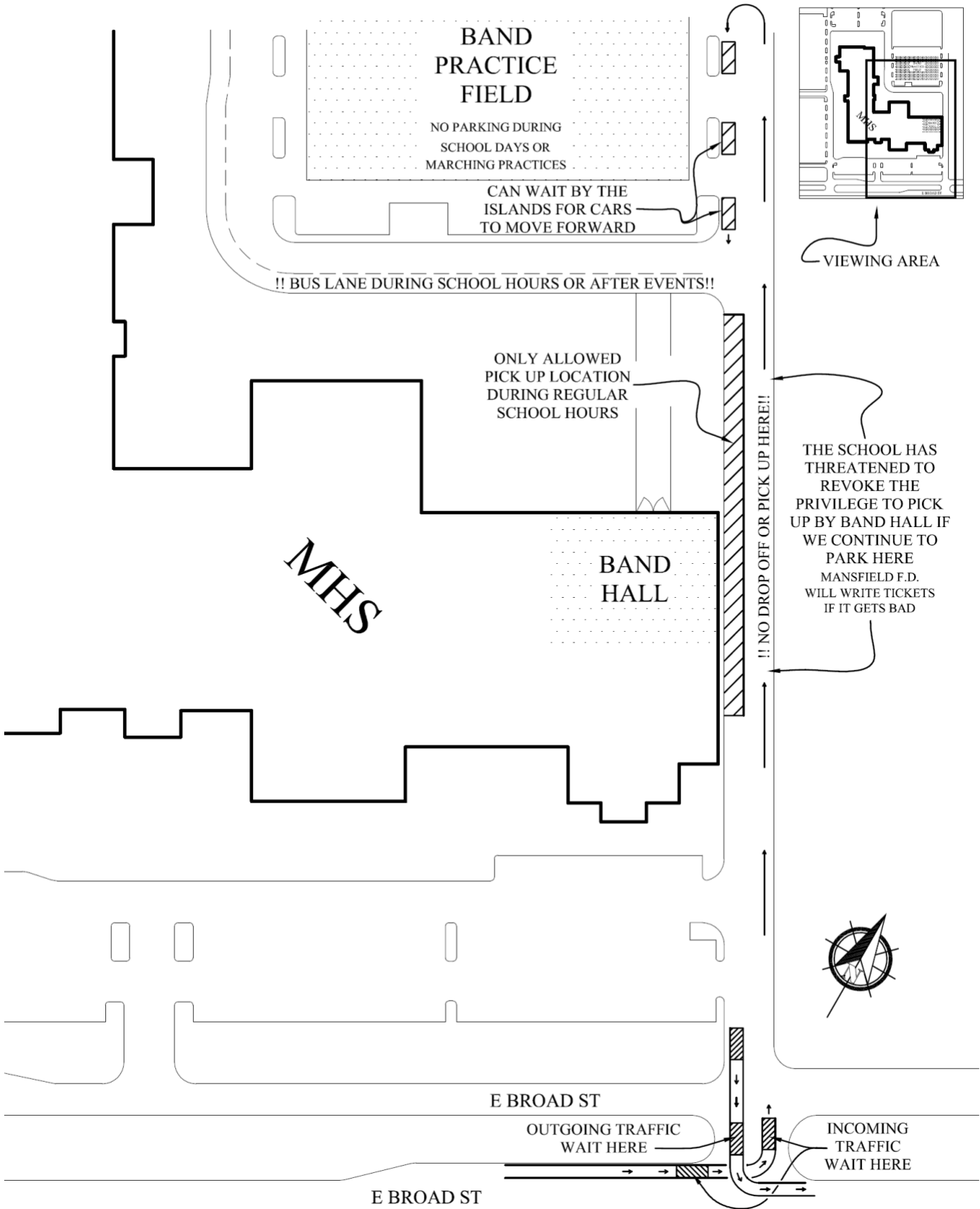
Community Service Hours: Most activities sponsored by the Band Boosters that entail work or fundraising are considered community service for college application purposes. Activities may include concession stand work, Tiger Trek, or performances related to community endeavors such as Relay for Life, Spring/Fall Mansfield City events, the Mansfield Hometown Holidays Parade, Mansfield Cares dinner, performing at senior centers, nursing homes and assisted living facilities.

Tutors: Many teachers have tutorials before or after school; in addition, many upper-class band students are volunteer tutors willing and able to assist as needed. See UIL Eligibility.

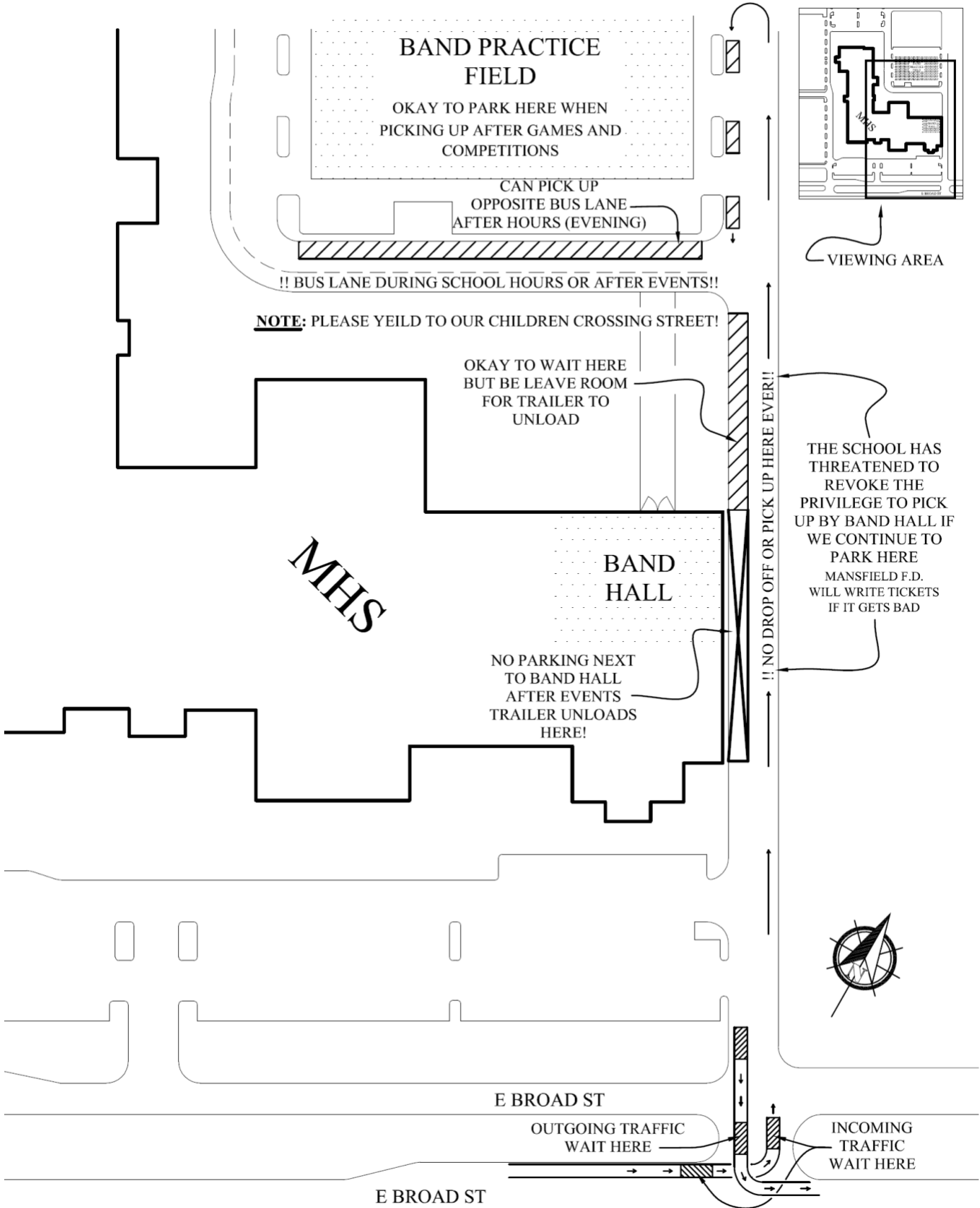
UIL Eligibility: Marching Band is a VARSITY activity. All UIL Eligibility rules apply to every performance and competition or paid event. Please see the UIL website for complete rules and regulations: <http://www.uil.utexas.edu/mus>. TEA maintains a “no-pass; no-play” policy. If a student receives a grade of less than 70 in any class, that student cannot participate for at least 3 weeks, although they must practice and rehearse. If the grade has improved by the following progress report, the student may resume participation in performances. Effective TIME MANAGEMENT is imperative during the fall semester. All grades can be accessed through Skyward on the MISD web page www.mansfieldisd.org. On Skyward, you can sign up for email notification if your student's grades fall below a threshold you select. A typical day consists of classes all day, after school practice until 6pm, eat, study and sleep. Friday nights are generally game/performance nights and many Saturdays have competition days. As you can see, there's no rest for the band! **Of note, band students' grades are generally higher during marching season when the band is busiest!**

Wednesday is typically a day of rest. We try to not have rehearsals on Wednesdays (sometimes we have to, check mhsband.com for exact calendar information.) When we don't have rehearsal, this is your day for **doctor's appointments**, rest and relaxation, studying, tutoring or to “pass off” on show material. It is very important that students DO NOT miss band rehearsal for doctor's appointments.

Communications

Announcements: We make every effort to post important information on the band remind101, the band web page, and the booster webpage. We will also send emails through CutTime. Please only use these approved methods, and the section parents as sources of information.

Web Pages: The MHS Director band web page is located at www.mhsband.com. It's a great resource for all events, information, schedules, maps, calendar etc.

The parent page is www.MHSTBB.com. It is the hub for Booster club information. The boosters also use CutTime for financials and communications such as emails and texts. Please make sure your email address listed in CutTime is one you check often.

Facebook: We encourage everyone to join the **2021-2022 MHS Tiger Band Pics/media** facebook group. Here is where you can upload, share, and view pictures and videos from the band's performances, practices, and events.

Fundraisers

Fundraisers: Why fundraise? Though the MISD provides all band programs with the same amount of operational funds, these funds are limited and fall short of the needs of a successful competitive band program. Additional funds are needed to purchase equipment, uniforms, and to pay for costs associated with some of the Band Contests and trips that our Band takes. It helps defer the costs of these events to make it more affordable for all Band members. Unlike other top bands across the state, we try to make band financially available to everyone (some local school's activity fee is \$950). We could choose to limit ourselves, but the Band Boosters and Directors believe that our students' potential is limitless. It is through the combined efforts of ALL the parents and students, that we have been able to keep our band fees extremely low. We NEED everyone to continue their contributions and involvement, in order to keep fees affordable for all.

Trailer Ads: MHS started out as the only high school marching band in the district with its own trailer. This has significantly helped defray the cost of transportation. In order to continue to use the trailer, advertisements are sold. Business and corporate ads start at \$500 for repeat renewing ads. Information will be posted on our website with specific ad costs and details. If you know of anyone who might be interested in advertising on the MHS Tiger Band Trailer, please have them contact the Band Booster Executive Board for more information. Generally for a logo all that is needed is a jpeg of their logo or ad and we take it from there!

Preview of Champions: 2021 will be the 10th year of our Preview of Champions Marching competition. This competition occurs at Vernon Newsom Stadium. All students and at least one parents is needed to run this competition that generates much-needed funds for our band program. This year, the competition will be held on Saturday, 25TH of September 2021.

Tiger Trek: This is a fundraiser for the MHS Tiger Band Boosters and individual band members. It is a "march-a-thon" that generally goes a couple of miles through pre-planned neighborhood routes. Students will receive a donation envelope and instructions at Spring Camp to start soliciting for donations. All donation envelopes must be returned! This is a HUGE and easy fundraiser for the band, and it's individual members.

Calendar – Yearly Highlights

Summer Events – See Calendar at mhsband.com for dates

SAT/ACT Testing: There are many of these test dates scheduled for the fall. These dates are included on the band calendar so you can easily identify which ones do NOT conflict with marching band competitions.

Spring Semester – See the Calendar at mhsband.com

Concert Season: Concert season really begins the first day of school. Although our fall focus is on marching band, all of the concert auditions for jazz, orchestra, and region band are held in the fall as well. Class time is spent working on music with master musicians and students are encouraged to have private lessons (MMEP scholarship funds are available). Every effort is made to allow for lessons during school hours. After marching competition season and football season are over, the focus turns to preparation for UIL and Solo and Ensemble Competitions.

UIL Band: UIL band competitions take place in the spring. UIL eligibility rules apply – no pass, no play. Afternoon UIL sectionals begin after Spring Break. There is a pre-UIL evening concert, and UIL competition performances usually take place during the school day.

Solo and Ensemble Competitions: There is an ensemble festival in late February, and a solo festival in late May. Every student is encouraged to participate/compete in this festival. Students in the top two performing bands MUST compete at this festival.

Spring Concert: This generally takes place toward the end of the school year.

NTCA Winter Guard Competition: We host a one-day Winter Guard competition as a fundraiser in either February or March. All guard parents and students are required to help with this, and we need help from the band parents as well.

Spring Band Trip: One of the highlights of band is the SPRING TRIP. Every year the band makes one out of town, overnight trip for competition. The location varies from year to year and information will be made available in the fall for each year's trip. *Students must be UIL eligible and all payments for the trip must be made in advance. The trip is optional, not mandatory.*

Band Banquet: The biggest social event of the year! This semi-formal event invites all students, parents and friends to help celebrate the accomplishments throughout the year and say good-bye to our seniors. It is generally held late in May and does not conflict with the Senior Prom. Many parents are needed to help in order to make this an outstanding event.

2021-2022 MHS Tiger Marching Band Fees

The MISD provides equal funds to all of the MISD high-school band programs. However, the MISD-budgeted funds are not sufficient to provide a world-class band / color-guard program. A successful marching band program, like ours, requires roughly \$175,000.00 in additional funds to operate at the high-level of competition the MHS Band will participate. Although fund-raising generates most of the funds, there are certain fees required by every band member.

ALL MEMBERS:

\$200.00 Activity Fee

Every student pays the activity fee. This fee helps to cover costs of items that benefit the band as a whole. This fee includes one show shirt, worn under the uniform bibbers. This fee also covers the cost of meals needed while at marching contests. **This is fee is lower than years past DUE TO THE GREAT FUNDRAISING EFFORTS OF ALL PARENTS.** In order to keep the fees this low (the lowest of any band program of our caliber) we need the continued commitment from all families to assist with the fundraising efforts.

\$10 Fan Shirt (current year shirt required)

This shirt is worn many times each season. Tiger Trek, Thursday rehearsals, Stadium rehearsals, and as well as some football games.

\$15 Extra Show Shirt (OPTIONAL)

One show shirt is included with the activity fee. This is not required.

\$80 Game Day Grub (OPTIONAL)

This will be for the fall marching season. On game/performance nights, the Band Boosters provide an optional pre-performance meal in the band hall from 3-3:30pm. To participate, students must sign up and the entire season must be paid for in advance at the start of Summer Band. This is a great way to ensure that your student is fed prior to the football game. To preserve the uniforms, students are not allowed to eat while in uniform, nor may they eat in the band hall. Due to time constraints and traffic, this may be the only option your student has to get a meal before a game night. ON game nights, the band is done around 11:30PM.

\$40 Uniform Cleaning Fee (Brass/Woodwind/Percussion)

This is paid by all brass, woodwind and percussion students. Students are responsible for handling their uniforms properly and hanging them correctly after games and competitions. Damage due to negligence will result in the student having to replace the uniform. Uniforms cost approximately \$750 to replace.

\$40 Marching Shoes (Brass/Woodwind/Percussion)

All freshman brass, woodwind and percussion students will need marching shoes. Returning brass, woodwind and percussion students may require new shoes as well, unless their shoes are clean, presentable, functional, and in GREAT condition.

\$5 Pair of Gloves (Brass & Woodwinds only)

These are required for brass and woodwind students. These thin, lightweight gloves take a beating, so it is suggested that students purchase two pairs.

\$80 MISD Instrument Rental Fee per YEAR

This is paid by any student who uses a school-owned instrument: Piccolo, Oboe, Bass Clarinet, Tenor Saxophone, Baritone Saxophone, French Horn, Euphonium, Tuba and Percussion. This is paid to the campus bookkeeper, it will appear as a fine on the student's school account.

2021-2022 MHS Color Guard Items

Items to be paid by June 15:

\$80.00 Spirit Uniform *everyone* (This year we have a new spirit uniform)

\$30 Jazz Shoe

Items to be paid on August 7:

\$200.00 Activity Fee

Every student pays the activity fee. This fee helps to cover costs of items that benefit the band as a whole. This fee includes one show shirt, worn under the uniform bibbers. \$40 Rifle (*if needed*) All members must have a rifle in GREAT condition

\$25.00 Flag Bag (*if needed*) All members must have a bag in GREAT condition

\$55.00 Guard Jacket (*if needed*) All members must have a bag in GREAT condition

\$15 Body Tights- everyone will need a new pair

Additional (optional) items to be ordered on August 7:

\$22 Joggers

\$23 Color guard Bag (Gym style and customizable)

\$6 Shoe Bag (Custom name)

PAYMENT SCHEDULE

August 7th- Band registration, uniform fitting, and accessory purchasing. All fees will need to be paid this day.

To make payments – ALWAYS put your check in a sealed envelope with your student's name on the outside and identify what the check is for. Please always note the student's name on the memo line of the check. This will help to ensure the monies are credited to the appropriate student.
